Bhavik Shah talked for Prashman via email with Ronak for the purpose of sharing his experiences for PG, MEE. He's a 1st year resident doctor in the Department of Radio diagnosis, MAMC, New Delhi.

Prashman: On behalf of Prashman, we congratulate you for your fantabulous success in the AJP, MEE-2011. So, how're you feeling about your new atmosphere? Settled down easily?

Ronak: Thanks to you for your good wishes. I feel very lucky working here. It's always a pleasure to be a part of a good institute.

Prashman: Behind every successful fellow, there lies an eternal source of INSPIRATION. So, can you tell us what your source of inspiration is?

Ronak: My parents always have dreamt of my success, and that is the biggest inspiration for me, even in future.

Prashman: As we know, little time remains for the GUJPG, MEE, what would be your tips for the PG Aspirants?

Ronak: As very less time's remaining, the important thing now, is to utilize this time properly, revise difficult topics, and at last, believe in your intuitions during exam.

Prashman: What's the important difference to be borne in mind during preparing for AJP, MEE and GUJPG-MEE?

Ronak: Difference between both exams is type of questions being asked, number of questions, time management during exam and sometimes, exam atmosphere. These should be kept in mind while preparing for both.

Prashman: In AAZA, so many answers are given wrong. Should they be left as they are or should they be corrected?

Ronak: Yes, in AAZA, many questions are wrong. Actually it depends on individual exam conducting body that which answers they are giving in answer key. But one should answer them correctly if asked.

Prashman: According to you, how important are the coaching classes for PG, MEE?

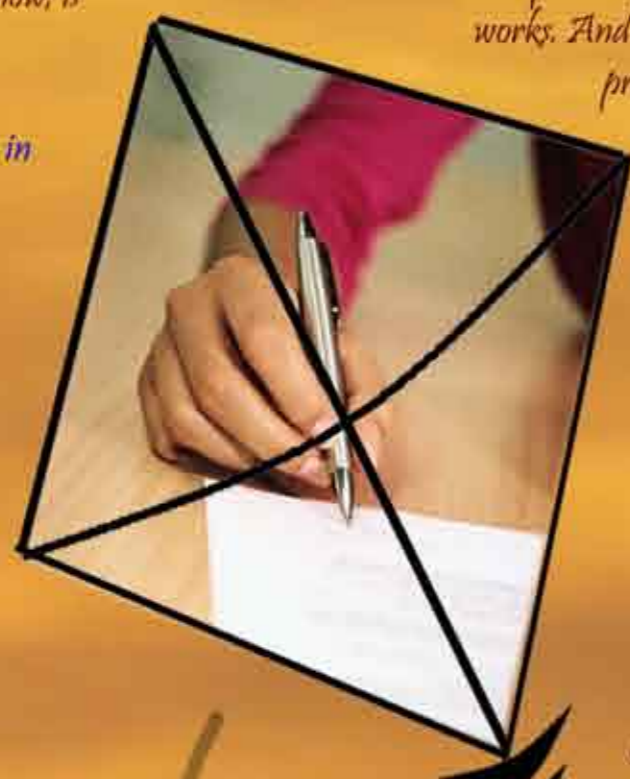
Ronak: It is very difficult to manage internship, coaching class and studying simultaneously. Eventually, either internship or reading gets hampered. So according to me, coaching class doesn't matter much if one has read all subjects in undergraduate course thoroughly.

Prashman: Is it fruitful to appear for entrance examinations of various nationalized institutes or one should concentrate more on a specific exam like AJP, MEE?

Ronak: Except for PG, most of exam formats are very similar. After proper preparation, giving entrance examination for various nationalized institutions always increases opportunity.

Prashman: So many students had difficulty in time management. Any special suggestions from you?

Ronak: There is a shortage of time for preparation. According to how many questions from particular subject are being asked, and spending enough time for important subjects may be helpful. Reading difficult topics repeatedly rather than whole content is also crucial.



Prashman: It's the peak time for MCQ based entrance examinations. How's the atmosphere among the medical students of Delhi for this kind of examinations?

Ronak: There is 100 percent entrance based admission for PG. No marks from UG merit counts, so students start preparing for MCQs during UG itself. They read MCQ books along with regular text books. That makes concepts clear.

Prashman: Does the clinical approach during UG, help in the preparations for PG, MEE?

Ronak: In AJP, MEE and many other exams, clinical case related questions are frequently asked. For that, clinical approach works. And anyhow clinical approach makes us stronger in skill and practical knowledge.

Prashman: According to you, when and how should one start the preparations for PG, MEE?

Ronak: It's better to start reading MCQ books along with theory, right from UG. As we read all subjects during UG in detail and solving MCQs at the same time is more helpful.

Prashman: What's the importance of using different globally preferred reference books, i.e. Harrison, Robbins, etc. for the PG, MEE?

Ronak: Reading standard text books always makes a huge difference. Most of entrance exam keys give references from standard text books. Details from such books depend on high quality trials and studies. So reading them is always fruitful, although time consuming.

Prashman: Thanks a ton for your guidance. I'm cent percent sure that your tips will be helpful for the PG aspirants of BJMC, as well as for the UG students. Thanks again.

Ronak: Anytime, and I wish all the best to all the PG aspirants of our college.
